

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Rochester

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Rochester is a local, autonomous, non-profit organization affiliated with the Boys & Girls Clubs of America. The Club is located in the southwest quadrant of Rochester, with satellite sites at Rochester City Schools No. 7, No. 29, Franklin High School and Seneca Manor public housing. Our mission is to inspire and enable young people of all backgrounds to realize their full potential as productive, responsible and caring citizens. In an effort to accomplish our mission, we implement after school programs which observe program standards nationally recognized to address the most critical issues affecting today's youth.

In an environment that seems more and more threatening to our youth, the Boys & Girls Clubs of Rochester provides a tangible measure of hope. The Club is a safe haven for neighborhood youth who are exposed to many at-risk factors such as one of highest rates of teen pregnancy in the state, high poverty, high crime rates and substance abuse. The Club serves approximately 550 youth a day between the five sites in the City of Rochester. A hot, nutritional meal is provided everyday to all youth, 88% of whom qualify for free or reduced-price lunch at school. The underlying philosophy of our program design is based on youth development research which demonstrates that youth who enter the world with a positive self-identity, competencies, community and civic involvement, health and well being and a moral compass can become responsible, self-sufficient, successful citizens and leaders. The Club continues to see a growing number of youth graduate from high school and enter a higher institution or pursue a career of their choice.

The Club has a long history of providing high-quality educational programming. Our Accelerated Reader program is one of the best reading comprehension programs in the City of Rochester. Five years ago the Club implemented the Accelerated Reader (AR) program, a highly motivating after-school reading program, which is the backbone of our literacy efforts. The AR program is centered on a computerized reading management system designed to encourage growth in reading skill and to foster an enthusiasm for reading. Participants enrolled in the program read over 5,000 books last school year. The five-year program continues to have phenomenal success and support from the community.

Boys & Girls Clubs programs and services promote and enhance the development of boys and girls by instilling:

- A Sense of Competence the feeling there is something youth can do and do well
- A Sense of Usefulness the opportunity to do something of value with other people
- A Sense of Belonging a setting where young people know they "fit" and are accepted
- A Sense of Power or Influence a chance to be heard and to influence decisions

THIS YEAR THE BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS OF ROCHESTER IS PLEASED TO RECOGNIZE COMMUNITY BASED ORGANIZATIONS AND LEADERS FOR THEIR CONTINUED SUPPORT OF THE CLUB

MONROE COUNTY DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE

The Monroe Count District Attorney's Office has helped the Boys & Girls Clubs of Rochester keep nearly 800 teens off the streets and involved in programs for the past five summers. Project Step Up has helped Boys & Girls Club staff to recruit some of the city's most high-risk youth into programs that teach conflict resolution, address barriers to employment, and improve physical fitness. The Monroe County District Attorney's Office staff has donated invaluable hours of volunteer time to club members who need a variety of services, ranging from homework to basic needs.

DEPARTMENT OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE AT RIT

Reading skills are a crucial piece of a child's academic success. The Department of Criminal Justice at RIT has supported the Boys & Girls Clubs of Rochester's Accelerated Reading Program for the past five years, through encouraging more than 900 club members to read nearly 10,000 books. This program has energized club members' willingness to read and has raised the average reading score to 90.5%. In the 2009-2010 program, 18 club members each read more than 100 books, including a record-breaking member who completed 200.

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Rochester is grateful for the significant achievements met by our members, thanks to the Department of Criminal Justice at RIT. When the program faced closure due to understaffing, the department provided the necessary support to meet demand and showed our community that improved literacy can lead to reductions in crime. More importantly, RIT gave club members the opportunity to participate in a fun-filled literacy program and to dispel the myth that children, especially those from the inner city, do not appreciate reading.

THE UNITED WAY OF GREATER ROCHESTER

The United Way of Greater Rochester binds together development activities provided by the Boys & Girls Clubs of Rochester. Through the efforts of the United Way, the Boys & Girls Clubs of Rochester are able to provide for nearly 2,100 youth and their families every year. Their commitment to school-age youth in Rochester is unprecedented.

Gilbert McCurdy

On February 16, 2010, the Boys and Girls Clubs of Rochester lost its founder, long time director and a loyal friend Gilbert McCurdy.

Gil McCurdy understood how critical it is for young people in our community to have a place to go after school. As a result, Mr. McCurdy, along with Ritter Shumway, raised the necessary funds to begin the Boys & Girls Clubs of Rochester in order bring quality youth programs to thousands of inner city youth.

Mr. McCurdy established a scholarship specifically for Boys & Girls Club members who wanted to pursue post secondary education, but saw financial hardship as a barrier. He was a quiet man, accomplishing these goals and requiring no praise while running a successful business and raising his own family with his wife Katie.

Mr. McCurdy attended the Harley School, the Hill School and was a graduate of Williams College. He served in the Army of Occupation in Japan (US Army Signal Corps.) and was the former Chairman and CEO of McCurdy & Company. Gil took over the business, expanded it and attracted fame by co-developing the Midtown Plaza and making McCurdy's Department Store a key player in the plaza.

He served as President of the Rochester Chamber of Commerce, Former Board Member of Pathway Houses, Life Trustee of the University of Rochester, Trustee of Roberts Wesleyan College. He was an active member of the First Baptist Church of Rochester.

Gil and his wife, Katherine McCurdy, were married for 63 years and have a daughter Lynda Horta and son Gilbert K. McCurdy.

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Rochester was honored to have such an incredible person on its board of directors. We will miss him.
